

ADVENTURE ISLAND ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

The Adventure Island Accessibility Guide provides an overview of services and facilities available for guests with disabilities at Adventure Island. We are committed to providing all guests with a safe and enjoyable environment.

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PART 1: GENERAL PARK INFORMATION

PARKING

Accessible parking spaces are available in the parking lot near the park entrance, with many of those spaces accessible to vans.

GUEST RELATIONS

Guest Relations is conveniently located just inside the Park Entrance. Please feel free to visit Guest Relations on the day of your visit if you have any questions regarding the services available. You will also need to visit Guest Relations to enroll in Adventure Island's Ride Accessibility Program (RAP).

WHEELCHAIRS AND ELECTRIC CONVENIENCE VEHICLES (ECV'S)

Guests may utilize their own wheelchairs or Electric Convenience Vehicles (ECV's). Guests are welcome join any ticketing or turnstile line to purchase tickets and to enter the park.

Wheelchairs available for rental based on availability inside the park, located to the right of Guest Relations. Electric Convenience Vehicles (ECV's) are not available for rental.

SEGWAYS

Two-wheeled, self-balancing electric vehicles, such as Segways, are not permitted at Adventure Island. We are pleased to offer alternative forms of transportation, including Electric Convenience Vehicles (ECV's) and wheelchairs.

ROLLATOR WALKERS

Guests are permitted to use their own rollator walkers; however, they may not be used as a substitute for a wheelchair or Electric Convenience Vehicle (ECV). Please note that guests are not allowed to be pushed while seated in a rollator walker. Rollator Walkers are not available for rental.

FIRST AID

The First Aid facility is located near the main entrance and is staffed by Registered Nurses or Emergency Medical Technicians. Please be aware that any Ambassador throughout the park can call for assistance on your behalf.

ACCESSIBILE RESTROOMS

All restrooms in the park are wheelchair accessible and are marked with a wheelchair symbol. Additionally, Adventure Island has Family or Companion restrooms available in the following locations:

- Duval Street (located adjacent to Colossal Pizza)
- Castaway Falls (located adjacent to Riptide and Castaway Falls)

GIFT SHOPS

All gift shops are wheelchair accessible. Please ask an Ambassador if you need any assistance.

RESTAURANTS

Most dining venues at Adventure Island offer cafeteria-style service.

PART 2: DISABILITY SERVICES

SERVICE ANIMALS

Service Animals are welcome at Adventure Island. Service Animals are limited to dogs and miniature horses only, that have been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability.

Service Animals must always remain on a leash or harness and under the control of their handler. If at any time your service animal's behavior is out of control, you will be asked to remove yourservice animal from the premises.

Service Animals must be housebroken. Relief areas are marked on the park map.

Service animals are not permitted in pools, rivers, or other water attractions and must remain at least 10 feet from the water's edge.

Emotional Support Animals are not permitted at Adventure Island.

HEARING DISABILITIES

Adventure Island provides complimentary Qualified American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters upon request. To request an ASL Interpreter, please us at AIT-AccessibilityServices@BuschGardens.com or call us at (813) 884-4FUN. We kindly ask that you request this service at least 14 days prior to your visit. You should receive a response to your e-mail within 7 days. However, if you haven't received a response within 7 days, please don't hesitate to email or call us again.

VISION DISABILITIES

Adventure Island offers complimentary park guidance upon request. To request a guide, please email <u>AIT-AccessibilityServices@BuschGardens.com</u> or call us at (813) 884-4FUN at least 14 days prior to your visit. If you do not receive a response within 7 days, we encourage you to follow up via email or phone.

Guests who are blind or have limited/low vision must have someone—either a companion or an Ambassador—explain the ride or attraction and read the ride requirements and instructions prior to riding. Please note that Ambassadors are unable to ride attractions with guests while assisting as a companion or guide.

AUTISM AND SENSORY NEEDS

Adventure Island's Ride Accessibility Program was designed to allow guests to fully participate and enjoy our parks while keeping in mind the safety requirements of our rides and attractions. Please refer to Part 4, Individual Ride Information, of this Accessibility Guide for more information.

Companion/Family Assist Restrooms are located at:

For those with sensory needs, manual flush toilets are available at the following restrooms:

- Mango Joe's Restrooms (behind the Mango Joe's bar)

FOOD ALLERGEN INFORMATION

Most dining venues at Adventure Island offer cafeteria-style service with allergy-friendly options available throughout the park.

While none of our restaurants are allergen-free, our team will take the utmost care to ensure that your meal is free from cross-contact.

Upon arriving at your chosen food venue, please proceed directly to a cashier and request to speak with a supervisor to explain your allergen concerns in detail. The supervisor can answer your questions and take your food order, to ensure your meal is prepared without any cross-contact.

RIDE ACCESSIBILITY PROGRAM

At Adventure Island, we have implemented programs to assist guests with disabilities. Our Ride Accessibility Program (RAP) aligns the individual abilities of our guests to the requirements of each ride, allowing guests to enjoy the park while keeping in mind the safety requirements of our rides and attractions. The RAP is based on the manufacturer's requirements for each ride and evaluates the physical and mental attributes required for a guest to safely ride an attraction.

It is the policy of Adventure Island that all guests can ride rides and enjoy attractions as long as they meet all requirements and such that it does not present a likely hazard to the guests or others.

Guests should visit Guest Relations, located just inside the park's entrance, to enroll in the RAP. Guests will receive a list of the rides and attractions they can ride.

Following enrollment in the RAP guests will be granted Special Access to our attractions. Special Access is designed to allow our guests to enjoy select rides and attractions without waiting in line if the guest is not able to do so because of his or her disability. It is available only for the listed rides and excludes shows, special events, parades, meet and greet priority access, gift shop check-out, or restaurant lines. Guests enrolled in the RAP will receive three (3) Virtual Queue Cards at a time. Once the three (3) Virtual Queue Cards have been used, guests will return to Guest Relations to obtain three (3) more.

The following procedures will assist you in utilizing our Ride Accessibility Program throughout the park:

1. Once enrolled in the RAP, proceed to the entrance of a listed ride on your Virtual Queue Card utilize the Quick Queue entrance.

- 2. When requested to do so, you will present your Virtual Queue Card to the Aquatics Ambassador. The ambassador will also request to see your RAP wristband. The Ambassador will keep the Virtual Queue Card and allow the guest onto the attraction.
- 3. The guest enrolled in the RAP must ride with their party. A maximum of 4 additional guests may accompany the guest needing special access. Additional guests must use the ride entrance.
- 4. Due to the age of some of our ride towers, not every tower attraction has a Quick Queue line and therefore cannot accommodate the Ride Accessibility Program.

Note: Guests may only have three (3) Virtual Queue Cards at a time and must use the Virtual Queue Card at the attraction listed on the Virtual Queue Card.

ADDITIONAL REQUESTS:

PART 3: GENERAL RIDE ACCESS INFORMATION

GENERAL RIDE RESTRICTIONS

Rides create forces and speeds that may not be acceptable or tolerable to some guests and may cause injury to some riders with known or unknown pre-existing conditions.

Many theme park rides incorporate safety systems designed by manufacturers to accommodate individuals of average physical stature and body proportion. These systems may impose restrictions on certain riders' ability to safely experience the ride. As a rule, only ride if you are in good health. Do not ride if you know or suspect you may be pregnant, have abnormal blood pressure, heart, neck, or back problems, are prone to motion sickness, have recently undergone surgery, or have any other condition that could be affected by the ride's features.

For all rides, guests must be able to:

- Maintain the proper riding position throughout the ride, by bracing themselves upright, keeping their head upright, and their back against the seatback.
- Properly use the ride device or restraint, keeping their hands, arms, legs, and feet down and inside the ride device at all times.
- Hold on tight to the assist bar or handles at all times.
- Demonstrate willingness and ability to comply with and understand verbal and written rider requirements and safety procedures.

HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements are posted at each ride. A height check station is also available at the front of the park. All guests, including those using wheelchairs, must meet the height requirement to ride.

RIDERS OF LARGER SIZE

Guests with certain body dimensions may not be accommodated on some of our attractions. Maximum weight limits are posted at select rides.

CASTS, BRACES, AND WALKING BOOTS

Guests wearing casts, braces or walking boots may be restricted from riding certain rides and should refer to Part 4, Individual Ride Information, of this Accessibility Guide for more information.

PROSTHETIC DEVICES AND AMPUTATIONS

Guests with any type of prosthesis may be restricted from riding certain rides. If permitted, riders must ensure that the prosthesis is properly secured before riding and should refer to Part 4, Individual Ride Information, of this Accessibility Guide for more information.

RIDE TRANSFERS

Ambassadors can offer assistance steadying a guest transferring to or from a wheelchair. Ambassadors may not lift or assist in lifting anyone using a wheelchair. All guests must be able to board a ride themselves or with the help from a member of their party.

RIDE ESCORTS

Ride escorts may be required due to temporary interruptions in operation. If a ride escort is required, guests may need to negotiate going down stairs or going up or down a slide without water flow but still potentially wet.

To expedite ride escort process, guests requiring assistance during the ride escort may be escorted last. Only one mobility-impaired guest may ride the attraction at one time unless they are in the same family. Please inquire about specific procedures prior to boarding a particular attraction.

BEFORE EXPERIENCING A RIDE:

- Note all safety warnings, both verbal and written, for each ride.
- Wait for all rides to come to a complete stop before attempting to board.
- Use caution when boarding, watching your head and step.
- Obey all instructions given by operators and lifeguards.
- Face forward and remain seated in the proper riding position.
- Hold on tight until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- Keep arms, hands, legs, and feet inside the ride at all times.
- Finish all food and beverages before riding.
- For water attractions, proper swimwear is required; clothing with zippers, buckles, denim, and rivets are prohibited. Water shoes and swim shirts may be worn on certain attractions. Cotton, sport shorts, and wetsuits are not permitted on body slides.

OXYGEN TANKS

Due to the dynamics and certain characteristics of the rides, oxygen tanks are not permitted on any ride or slide. However, oxygen tanks are permitted inside the park and may be brought into merchandise shops, restaurants, and other enclosed facilities. Oxygen Concentrators may be permitted on some rides if they can be secured and meet the loose article requirements for a specific ride.

RIDE DEFINITIONS

Supervising Companion: Someone who meets all physical and mental requirement to ride the ride, is 14 years of age or older and demonstrates maturity equivalent to that of someone aged 14 or older.

Accompanied By: When a guest requires accompaniment, the accompanying individual must meet all ride requirements and assist the guest accordingly. This assistance includes aiding the guest in boarding and exiting, as well as assisting the guest down stairs, catwalks, or ladders if a ride escort is necessary. Depending on the ride, the accompanying individual may also need to help the guest maintain postural control while riding.

Hand-held Infant: A hand-held infant is a child who is unable to walk to the ride unit independently or maintainindependent seated postural control.

Functioning Extremity: A functioning extremity is a limb over which a person has control. A prosthetic device isconsidered a functioning extremity.

RIDERSHIP CRITERIA

As described in Part 2 of this Accessibility Guide, Adventure Island's Ride Accessibility Program (RAP) aligns the individual abilities of our guests to the requirements of each ride, allowing guests to enjoy the park while keeping in mind the safety requirements of our rides and attractions. The RAP is based on the manufacturer's requirements for each ride and evaluates the physical and mental attributes required for a guest to safely ride an attraction. Some of those may include the following:

Ability to maintain the proper riding position throughout the ride. The guest must have the body and spinalcontrol to maintain the proper riding position throughout the ride without the aid of other people or devices and be able to maintain the proper riding position even during bumping or other characteristic movements of the ride.

Weight distribution to allow the ride device to function as designed. The weight distribution of the guest's body must not interfere with the ride handles or any of the safety devices as they were designed.

Control of upper torso – including head and neck. The guest must have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck, and upper torso in the proper position during the ride or attractions designed dynamic motions.

Ability to hold on with one functioning hand. A functioning hand is an upper extremity or prosthesis with fingers that has the ability to grasp the assist bar and ride device handles while exhibiting good grip control and is strong enough to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride.

Ability to hold on with two functioning hands. Ability to hold on with two functioning hands as described above.

Ability to hold on with one functioning arm. A functioning arm is an upper extremity or prosthesis that has theability to arm-grip the assist bar or ride device handles by wrapping the arm around the assist bar and ride device handles and is strong enough to allow the guest to maintain the proper riding position

throughout the duration of the ride.

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms. Ability to hold on with two functioning arms as described above.

Ability to brace self with one functioning leg. Guest must have one functioning leg, natural or prosthetic, forbracing their body during the course of the ride or attraction.

Ability to brace self with two functioning legs. Guest must have two functioning legs, natural or prosthetic, to be used for bracing their body during the course of the ride or attraction and maintaining balance when enteringand exiting a ride or attraction.

Minimum of two functioning extremities. Guest must have a minimum of two functioning extremities, naturalor prosthetic (two arms, two legs, or one arm and one leg), to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride or attraction.

Minimum of three functioning extremities. Guest must have a minimum of three functioning extremities, natural or prosthetic (two legs and an arm or two arms and a leg) to allow the guest to brace in a tripod mannerduring the ride.

Ability to hold on or brace: Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and ride device handles and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on a ride and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seatedposition during the forces of the ride.

Ability to enter and exit the ride without endangering self or others. Guest must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include entering through an exit or having someone aid him or her in boarding. If a guest has to be lifted in and out of a ride unit, they must be accompanied by a supervising companion who is accustomed to doing this. For the safety of ride or attraction operators and the guest, our operators are instructed not to perform this function, other than in children's ride areas.

Appropriate Observed Conduct. Guest must demonstrate appropriate observed conduct by indicating a willingness and ability to understand, participate in, and follow all rider requirements. Appropriate observed conduct may include but not be limited to, maintaining the proper riding position, attention to and compliancewith safety instructions, proper use of restraints and safety equipment and a willingness to participate in the attraction.

In addition to the basic physical and mental requirements defined above, each ride is evaluated relative to temporary conditions which may prevent a guest from safely riding a specific ride. Some of the specific conditions evaluated include:

- Cervical collar or neck brace
- Broken collar bone
- Full arm cast
- Braced arm cast
- Lower arm cast
- Full leg cast
- Lower leg cast

PART 4: INDIVIDUAL RIDE ACCESS INFORMATION

(Listed in alphabetical order)

The following descriptions are designed to provide information on the type of actions caused by various rides along with their unique restrictions. If you enrolled in the Ride Accessibility Program, follow the directions listed under each ride below.

ARUBA TUBA

Enclosed water slide that will heighten all your senses as you shoot through the dark to the bottom and into a splash pool.

Ride Access: Guests using wheelchairs will need to transfer from their wheelchair to ascend or descend the steps of the tower. In addition to this, guests will need to enter/exit the slide start tub and transfer on to the ride tube. Guests will need to exit the slide splash pool. Maximum water depth is three (3) feet.

Height Requirements: Guests must be at least 42 inches tall to ride.

Weight Restrictions: 300 lbs. maximum for a single tube and 600 lbs. maximum for a double tube.

Ride Restrictions: Riders of this attraction will be exposed to forces, speeds, and other intense features that may cause distress or injury to persons with pre-existing health conditions. Please consider these features when determining suitability for all riders.

For your safety, only guests in good health should ride this attraction. Do not ride if you are currently or suspect to be pregnant, have high blood pressure, heart, neck or back problems, fear of heights, a sensitivity to strobe effects or dark enclosed places, prone to motion sickness, an unusual sensation (e.g. headache, blurred vision, nausea), have had recent surgery, or have any other medical condition that may be aggravated by the features of this attraction.

Life vests, Agua shoes and/or agua socks are permitted.

Physical Restrictions: Each rider must be able to remain seated upright, keeping their head upright, their back and shoulders against the tube and maintain the proper riding position at all times. Rider must have the ability to enter/exit the ride without endangering self or others. Riders must be able to brace with one (1) functioning leg & grip with two (2) functioning arms & hands capable of grasping the handhold points to maintain a safe riding posture. Riders must have full upper and full lower body control. Riders with cervical collar or neck brace, broken collar bone, full or braced arm casts, full or lower leg casts, or braces between legs are not permitted. Wrist or forearm casts and exposed metal on prosthesis devices must be covered with a pad. Riders with any type of prosthesis device must ensure that it is properly secured and will remain in place despite forces experienced during the ride.

Please review all restrictions listed on the sign at the entrance prior to riding.

BARRACUDA BAILOUT

A thrilling enclosed slide for those who aren't brave enough for Vanish Point and decide to Bailout!

Ride Access: Guests using wheelchairs will need to transfer from their wheelchair to ascend or descend the steps of the tower. In addition to this, guests will need to enter/exit the slide start tub and transfer on to the ride. Guests will need to exit the slide runout. Maximum water depth is ten (10) inches.

Height Requirements: Guests must be at least 48 inches tall to ride.

Weight Restrictions: 300 lbs. maximum weight per rider

Ride Restrictions: Riders of this attraction will be exposed to forces, speeds, and other intense features that may cause distress or injury to persons with pre-existing health conditions. Please consider these features when determining suitability for all riders.

For your safety, only guests in good health should ride this attraction. Do not ride if you are currently or suspect to be pregnant, have high blood pressure, heart, neck or back problems, fear of heights, a sensitivity to strobe effects or dark enclosed places, prone to motion sickness, an unusual sensation (e.g. headache, blurred vision, nausea), have had recent surgery, or have any other medical condition that may be aggravated by the features of this attraction.

Life vests, aqua shoes and/or aqua socks are not permitted.

Physical Restrictions: Each rider must be able to remain seated properly and maintain the proper riding position at all times. Rider must have the ability to enter/exit the ride without endangering self or others. Riders must be able to brace with two (2) functioning legs & grip with one (1) functioning arms & hand capable of grasping. Riders must have full upper and full lower body control. Riders with a cervical collar or neck brace, broken collar bone, full or braced arm casts, wrist, or forearm casts, full or lower leg casts, or braces between legs are not permitted. Exposed metal on prosthesis devices must be covered with a pad. Riders with any type of prosthesis device must ensure that it is properly secured and will remain in place despite forces experienced during the ride. Please review all restrictions listed on the sign at the attraction entrance prior to riding.

CALYPSO COASTER

Enjoy twists, turns, and soaking wet fun on this open flume water ride.

Ride Access: Guests using wheelchairs will need to transfer from their wheelchair to ascend or descend the steps of the tower. In addition to this, guests will need to enter/exit the slide start tub and transfer on to the ride tube. Guests will need to exit the slide splash pool. Maximum water depth is three (3) feet.

Height Requirement: Guests must be at least 42 inches tall to ride.

Weight Restrictions: 300 lbs. maximum for a single tube and 600 lbs. maximum for a double tube.

Ride Restrictions: Riders of this attraction will be exposed to forces, speeds, and other intense features that may cause distress or injury to persons with pre-existing health conditions. Please consider these features when determining suitability for all riders.

For your safety, only guests in good health should ride this attraction. Do not ride if you are currently or suspect to be pregnant, have high blood pressure, heart, neck or back problems, fear of heights, a sensitivity to strobe effects or dark enclosed places, prone to motion sickness, an unusual sensation (e.g. headache, blurred vision, nausea), have had recent surgery, or have any other medical condition that may be aggravated by the features of this attraction.

Life vests, aqua shoes and/or aqua socks are permitted.

Physical Restrictions: Each rider must be able to remain seated upright, keeping their head upright, their back and shoulders against the tube and maintain the proper riding position at all times. Rider must have the ability to enter/exit the ride without endangering self or others. Riders must be able to brace with one (1) functioning leg & grip with two (2) functioning arms & hands capable of grasping the handhold points to maintain a safe riding posture. Riders must have full upper and full lower body control. Riders with a cervical collar or neck brace, broken collar bone, full or braced arm casts, full or lower leg casts, or braces between legs are not permitted. Wrist or forearm casts and exposed metal on prosthesis devices must be covered with a pad. Riders with any type of prosthesis device must ensure that it is properly secured and will remain in place despite forces experienced during the ride.

Please review all restrictions listed on the sign at the attraction entrance prior to riding.

CARIBBEAN CORKSCREW

Twist and turn down this high-speed enclosed slide.

Ride Access: Guests using wheelchairs will need to transfer from their wheelchair to ascend or descend the steps of the tower. In addition to this, guests will need to enter/exit the slide start tub and transfer on to the ride. Guests will need to exit the slide runout. Maximum water depth is eight (8) inches.

Height Requirements: Guests must be at least 48 inches tall to ride.

Weight Restrictions: 300 lbs. maximum weight per rider

Ride Restrictions: Riders of this attraction will be exposed to forces, speeds, and other intense features that may cause distress or injury to persons with pre-existing health conditions. Please consider these features when determining suitability for all riders.

For your safety, only guests in good health should ride this attraction. Do not ride if you are currently or suspect to be pregnant, have high blood pressure, heart, neck or back problems, fear of heights, a sensitivity to strobe effects or dark enclosed places, prone to motion sickness, an unusual sensation (e.g. headache, blurred vision, nausea), have had recent surgery, or have any other medical condition that may be aggravated by the features of this attraction.

Life vests, aqua shoes and/or aqua socks are not permitted.

Physical Restrictions: Each rider must be able to remain seated properly and maintain the proper riding position at all times. Rider must have the ability to enter/exit the ride without endangering self or others. Riders must be able to brace with two (2) functioning legs & grip with one (1) functioning arms & hand capable of grasping. Riders must have full upper and full lower body control. Riders with a cervical collar or neck brace, broken collar bone, full or braced arm casts, wrist, or forearm casts, full or lower leg casts, or braces between legs are not permitted. Exposed metal on prosthesis devices must be covered with a pad. Riders with any type of prosthesis device must ensure that it is properly secured and will remain in place despite forces experienced during the ride.

Please review all restrictions listed on the sign at the attraction entrance prior to riding.

CASTAWAY FALLS – INTERACTIVE PLAY

With multiple levels and more than 100 distinct play elements, it's an ideal spot for kids of all ages – even the littlest adventurers!

Ride Access: Accessible to mobility impaired guests, including a transfer space, a transfer platform with grab bars, and transfer steps. Guests using wheelchairs will need to transfer from their wheelchair to ascend or descend the steps of the play structure. Water depth ranges from zero (0) to six (6) inches.

Height Requirements: None. Hand-held infants are permitted on this attraction but must be accompanied by a supervising companion. Please note that hand-held infants are not permitted on the slides.

Weight Restrictions: None

Ride Restrictions: Riders of this attraction will be exposed to forces, speeds, and other intense features that may cause distress or injury to persons with pre-existing health conditions. Please consider these features when determining suitability for all riders.

For your safety, only guests in good health should ride this attraction. Do not ride if you are currently or suspect to be pregnant, have high blood pressure, heart, neck or back problems, fear of heights, a sensitivity to strobe effects or dark enclosed places, prone to motion sickness, an unusual sensation (e.g. headache, blurred vision, nausea), have had recent surgery, or have any other medical condition that may be aggravated by the features of this attraction. Aqua shoes and/or aqua socks are permitted on the attraction but are not permitted on the slides. Life vests are permitted and recommended for weak swimmers, non-swimmers, and those under 42 inches.

Physical Restrictions: Each rider must be able to sit upright and maintain the proper riding position including control of their upper torso, head, and neck at all times.
